## RESPONSE TO GRAND JURY REPORT

Additional information from Templeton Unified School District:

### FINDINGS:

2. We disagree partially with a portion of the description in finding number F4. Specifically, in relation to the underlined portion of the finding, “School Districts have different approaches to address mental health and there is no uniformity.” We believe it is a miscategorization that there is no uniformity among schools in approaches to address mental health. We believe it would be more accurate to describe that there is some uniformity or commonality in the practices of SLO County high schools, though more sharing and collaboration would indeed benefit all schools collectively.

### RECOMMENDATIONS:

2. Recommendations numbered R2, R5, and R7 have not yet been fully implemented, but will be implemented in the future. Following is a table outlining the estimated timeline for implementing these recommendations.

Recommendation Number	Estimated Implementation Timeline
R2	School administrators will identify ways to extend the mental health curriculum beyond Freshman health during the 2023-24 school year, with implementation no later than the 2024-25 school year.
R5	Select Templeton administrators will participate in the Youth Mental Health First Aid program training in 2023-24 in order to identify if this or another training will then be provided to staff in 2024-25 and beyond.
R7	Templeton High School has a productive partnership with SLO Behavioral Health for contracted mental health services. The proportion of this service has more than doubled in recent years. Templeton High School will consider increasing this service in future school years (as soon as the 2024-25 school year) <u>subject to staff availability</u> at SLO Behavioral Health and <u>subject to available funding</u> .
